Everything Is Performance is a devised play -- meaning it was created by the cast -about a fictitious reality TV show called "Know Your Worth!" A month and a half ago these artists walked into rehearsal with a single prompt: "What are ways you perform your identity and/or what ways do you see identity performed in our culture?" The entire show was conceived of, written, rehearsed and designed in the past weeks of inquiry, improv, and collaborative dreaming. The production is a collage, much like our virtual and media world, and utilizes sketch comedy, viral dance, neutral mask work, live video feed, and more. It takes the tropes and tools of the theater and entertainment world, spinning elements together to examine who we are, how we perform who we are, who benefits from that performance, and how we might work towards authenticity. Guiding this group of talented, artistically committed, creative, and insightful students was inspiring -- they drew deep from their own experiences to boldly speak truths and craft unapologetic characters. I am deeply changed by the process of coming together after almost two years without live, fully embodied indoor performance as we wrestle with an ongoing cultural revolution -- while wearing masks -- to realize this collective vision.
