Director's Note

Some Dictionaries define "shout" as a loud cry, a call to attention, or a command of cessation. At this present moment in history, we constantly find ourselves inundated with rhetoric that takes away the humanity of the underprivileged and underrepresented; people who are constantly forced to shout just to be heard, and seen, and given the dignity of a human being. *shOUT: The Queer Theatre Project* is a combined effort of queer students, artists, faculty, and their allies from across UMBC's campus to come together and cry loudly, call attention to the full joyous lives of this community, and say, "Stop! Enough is enough! We're here! We're queer!" To the folks calling for a ban on saying the word gay, we say, "Don't Say Gay, SHOUT it!" To the folks more interested in forbidding children from attending drag brunch than forbidding unfit people from purchasing automatic rifles, we're prepared to shout you down as well. It's time to get loud. It's time to celebrate. It's time to express our inner joy in every queer way possible. Welcome to our bar; our safe space; our sacred kingdom. Pull up a chair, laugh, sing, dance, and shout with us.





Gerrad Alex Taylor (he/him/his) is an award-winning director and actor based out of the greater Baltimore region. In 2021, he was named one of Baltimore's "40 Under 40" by the Washington Business Journal. He holds a BA in Neuroscience from Johns Hopkins University and an MFA in Performance from University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Gerrad leads Chesapeake Shakespeare Company's Black Classical Acting Ensemble, an affinity space for Black artists in Baltimore created to examine the classical theatrical system and interrogate what more equitable practices may look like moving forward in the 21st century.

He has also worked as an actor, director, and educator for theatres and educational institutions across the country including the Great River Shakespeare Festival, St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, Pacific Conservatory Theatre-PCPA, North Carolina A&T, Everyman Theatre, Mosaic Theatre Company, Constellation Theatre Company, Arena Stage, Studio Theatre, and Washington Stage Guild.

He is a member of the Actor's Equity Association and the Society of American Fight Directors.




