Apply today at undergraduate.umbc.edu/apply. Please indicate Theatre as your preferred major.

## **Bachelor of Arts in Theatre**

Admission to the Bachelor of Arts in Theatre majors (Design and Production, Theatre Education, Theatre Studies) does not require an audition or portfolio review, with the exception of those applying for the Linehan Artist Scholars Program.

## **Bachelor of Fine Arts in Acting**

Admission to the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Acting major is by audition only. Students may audition for the major prior to enrolling at UMBC or during the first year of study.

## **Freshmen Fall Enrollment**

- November 1: Early Action Admission
  - Linehan Artist Scholars are encouraged to apply by this date.
- January 15: Linehan Artist Scholar Applications and Supplemental Materials due
- February 1: Regular Decision Admission

## **Transfer Fall Enrollment**

- March 1: Priority Admission
- June 1: Regular Admission

#### **Freshmen and Transfer Spring Enrollment**

- October 15: Priority Admission
- December 1: Regular Admission
